

Eugene Revitch, professor, psychiatrist

Eugene Revitch, 87, died Saturday (Sept. 14, 1996) at Martin's Run Life Care Community in Media, Pa.

He was born in Yelgava, Latvia.

Dr. Revitch, a graduate of the University of Montpelier in Montpelier, France, and the University of Paris Medical School, received Medical Board certification in psychiatry and neurology.

He was a captain in the Army Medical Corps during World War II.

Dr. Revitch held a number of positions in psychiatry. He had a private practice in psychiatry and neurology in Plainfield and was the forensic psychiatrist at the New Jersey State Diagnostic Center in Menlo Park. He served on staff and as a consultant in electroencephalography and psychiatry at Lyons Veterans Affairs Medical Center.

Dr. Revitch was also a clinical professor of psychiatry at Robert Wood Johnson School of Medicine in Piscataway, director emeritus in the Department of Psychiatry at John F. Kennedy Medical Center in Edison and a consultant in psychiatry at Muhlenberg Hospital in Plainfield.

Dr. Revitch co-authored three books with Louis Schlesinger entitled, "Sexual Dynamics of Anti-Social Behavior," "Psychopathology of Homicide," and "Sex Murders and Sex Aggression." He also published 35 articles in professional journals.

Surviving are his wife, Esther Tulichinsky Revitch of Media, Pa.; a daughter, Judith Porter of Ardmore, Pa.; three grandchildren; and a sister, Adele Honnigwill of New York City.
